1. In charts where Jupiter has less than 4 points, which are not in the majority, Jupiter would give benefic aspects, correct?

You are correct. But when any planet aspects houses A, B or C, it is disqualified to give results – good or bad.

Jupiter in house B *always* aspects house C, so it will not give the result. Therefore, when we are concerned with Jupiter, it does not give the result for the house in which it is situated.

2. Can you tell us more about the effects of the planets that are posited in the 12th from house B?

Any planet being situated in the 12th from house B, though it be a strong karyesh (significator), it may not give the result. It should be considered debilitated. (Krushna writes: *You many suggest another name for this so there is no confusion with the debilitated planet as per sign – like Jupiter in Capricorn*).

3. What about the KAS effects of the Sun and Moon when posited in their respective debilitation signs, and comparing the principles of KAS versus classical Vedic astrology?

The Sun in the 4th in Libra is said to have no ‘dosha’ or defect, while the Moon in the 5th in Scorpio is also exempt from being in its neecha rashi (fall). Their sight on the 10th and 11th houses respectively, is good (not considering their points). Those being in the neecha rashi, with their sight on those prominent places (the 10th and the 11th), will enhance the results of those houses.
